This year the sports funding will be used in a variety of ways to further improve and develop teaching and learning across the whole academy. We will encourage pupils to continue to lead healthy lifestyles, enjoy PE and sport and experience high quality teaching. Children will be encouraged to take part in competition and aim for sporting excellence through close links with other schools both within the Delta Academies Trust and the local community.

Over the past 3 years we have used sports funding to purchase a sports partnership package with De Lacy Academy who have provided The Vale Primary Academy with PE specialists to work alongside our teachers to develop their skills and knowledge and to enhance the quality of the teaching of physical education.

Through monitoring and evaluation the academy recognises the positive impact on the quality of the teaching of PE and the need to use our funding in 2016/2017 in different ways.

Having already seen impact of the funding from the previous 3 years we hope for this additional funding to have continued and sustained impact on provision of PE and sport within our academy. Learning walks, lesson observations and monitoring by SLT and the PE leader, have identified the following areas to address in PE this year: high quality resources to support the demands of PE, developing teachers skills and knowledge to deliver consistently good or better lessons which ensure progression and increased awareness of healthy lifestyles.

Pupils will also have many opportunities to participate in competitive events in various locations.
