Foundation Stage:

Foundation Stage have loved learning about weddings this week, and particularly enjoyed our visit to the Church! The children asked lots of questions and were keen to find out what happens at a wedding ceremony!



Year 1: This week in Year 1 we have been making up our very own ingredients. In Math, we have been recognising numbers up to 40 and counting backwards from 40. Also, it has been so much fun discussing different medieval weapons, making our own catapults and testing how far they can shoot different materials.



Year 2: We have had a brilliant week in Year 2! We have learnt a rap about different weapons used to attack castles and we have even created our very own catapults that we can't wait to test. In literacy we have created our own dragons.



Year 3: What a week we've had! This week in Year 3 we have been carrying on with our letter writing, really getting stuck in to using those key skills and making sure we set it out correctly. Our Maths has been amazing! Using our arrays and materials, those tricky multiplication sums have been no problem at all. We've also begun to look at plants in our science which has meant we can start doing some pretty cool experiments. Keep it up Year 3.



Year 4: Another busy week in Year 4 as the children have been using their multiplication knowledge to solve multi-step problems. We have been debating in writing as we are writing letters to persuade. Our afternoons have again been packed full of practical science as we have explored circuits and electricity. Everyone has worked super hard this week!



Year 5: This week we have really developed our understanding of prime numbers and how to establish if a number is prime or not; how to interpret negative numbers in context counting both forwards and backwards. The children have also produced some amazing newspaper reports based from our class read.



Year 6: This week we have been focusing on inference in our reading. We've broken down challenging questions and we've been able to P.E.E. on our page! In writing we have been exploring newspaper reports, thinking about the structure, grammar and vocabulary choices. In Maths we've been furthering our knowledge on area, volume and surface area. Finally in topic we have been investigating shadow through dance and shape; Year 6 have seemed to really enjoy it! Another good week, let's keep up the hard work.
