This week in Foundation Stage we have enjoyed playing games with our friends involving money and acting out shopping with coins!



Year 1: This week the class as a whole have been amazing at adding and subtracting up to 20! Well done to those who have really tried hard with their problem solving. We have had fun using stippling, shading and hatching, to create effects within Art, whilst drawing our castles.




Year 3: This week in Year 3 we've been working really hard on our addition and subtraction again but this time doing it mentally! On top of that our setting descriptions are really coming on, they're overflowing with adjectives and sensory language, it's like you're really there. In our topic we've been learning about the continents and the countries within them. This has led to some really exciting sessions, and those four figure grid references we learnt last week proved to come in pretty handy. Keep up the good work Year 3!



Year 2: This week Year 2 have been working hard on adding numbers to 100. We have loved the challenge of working with bigger tens and ones. We are loving our new reading book 'The Tunnel'! It is very exciting and we can't wait to see what happens to the brother and sister. We are looking forward to making our catapults in topic so we can test how strong our biscuit castle walls are. We don't think they will be strong enough to stop the enemies attack!

Year 4: This week year 4 has been very busy! The children have worked very hard in Maths using the formal written method to solve two and three digit multiplication problems. We have continued our Diary Entries but this week the children have been imagining they have been stranded on an island. The work has been fantastic! Forces and creating our own science experiments has been the focus of our afternoons. Everyone has loved learning about gravity, air resistance, friction and magnetism!

Year 5: This week the children have been concentrating on adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator but also denominators of the same multiple – this proved tricky at first but they didn't let it stop them! In writing the children have further developed their diary writing skills and I could not be prouder! We have also started reading our new class read 'Cool' by Michael Morpurgo.



Year 6: This week we've started our new reading book 'A Boy in Striped Pyjamas'. We've already learnt a great deal about the main character's personality and have focused on find and retrieval questions. In Maths we have been working hard, developing our understanding of how to find percentages. In writing we have continued to write our letters to Jack, including parenthesis, inverted commas and contractions. We have launched a new focus in topic – something very exciting to come, so keep your eyes peeled!!
