Foundation Stage: What a fantastic first week back in EYFS, the children have loved our new topic 'People Who Help Us' and have already come up with some great ideas. The children have been writing their own letters, inviting people into school over the next few weeks!



Year 1: Year 1 have certainly impressed me this week. We have also started our wonderful, new topic – Around the World in 54 Days! Our journey has begun in India. On Monday we tasted Indian food, watched Bollywood videos and we learnt some of the dance moves used. We have worked extremely well in groups to describe the different areas in India.



Year 3: Welcome back Year 3! I am so proud of all the children this week, they have all come back with such an incredible attitude and are ready to learn. We've gone straight into our multiplication and division again this week, and are getting quicker at our times tables. On top of that, we have been tackling inverted commas, which have proved tricky, but we are getting there. Keep up the hard work Year 3! It's been a fun week for us all!



Year 2: It has been a great start to the half term. On our first day we explored our new topic Around the World in 54 days. We did Bhangra dancing, tasted Chinese food and listened to the sounds of the Amazon rainforest. In Maths we have been investigating measurement. We really enjoyed measuring out the lengths of different animals in the world and comparing them to ourselves.



Year 4: We have had a great first week back! We have begun our new topic 'Animals Around the World', and we kicked it off by looking at animal adaptations. We have also received a lovely letter from an old friend, and have been writing a reply to her. Maths has been fun but challenging this week as we have been learning about equivalent fractions.



Year 5: What a great week we have had in Year 5! After Mr Williams discovered some dinosaur bones outside our classroom we have decided to do our topic this term about the prehistoric world. We have written our own newspaper reports about the discovery, which we will be delivering to other classes to read soon. In Maths we have been making huge strides, working hard on finding percentages and fractions of amounts.



Year 6: What a fantastic first week back we have had in Year 6. Everybody has come back to school with the mind-set to work incredibly hard! In reading, we have focused on the meaning of vocabulary, in writing, we've begun to write short action stories and in Maths, we have investigated coordinates and angles. World War 2 is our topic for the term – and what excitement we have had already! The air raid siren has sounded on a number of occasions; allowing us to feel fully immersed in our learning.
