Year 1: In Year 1, we have been using lots of amazing adjectives to describe the fairies and the goblins that help our school. I have loved seeing the imagination of the children soar! We have also tried really hard to improve our team work within PE and topic.



Year 2: This week year 2 having been on the hunt for fairies and goblins. Unfortunately we discovered that they are disappearing because people no longer believe in them. As a class we have decided to create leaflets to stop this from happening and make everyone aware of how important they are to the environment. It has been lovely to see the children so excited about their writing.



Year 3: Year 3 are working really hard at the moment. They all understand place value and are currently working on addition and subtraction in Maths. We even used the children for a visual demonstration which really helped some children understand it better. In English we have been using persuasive language. The children have looked at what vocabulary is best for persuading people to hold a festival.



Year 4: Year 4 have worked extremely hard this week. Angles has been the focus this week in maths and everyone has tried their best. In writing we have moved onto persuasive writing. We have been talking about our festival topic and we are trying to persuade a music artist to attend. There has been some fantastic persuasive language been used. In our afternoons we have been looking at our topic and looking in detail at some festival events.



Year 5: Another great week in Year 5. We have been working extremely hard within our Curriculum work and have decided what activities we could do if we ran our own festival. Within our Maths, we have solved various problems relating to place value including interpreting negative numbers from charts.
