
Year 1: We have been acting out the story of 'How to Catch a Star' in Year 1. The children have had such fantastic memories. They have also revisited exploring multiplication and division using objects and pictures. They have progressed so much from the last time they tackled these types of questions. For Challenge X, they have created some wonderful banners that they can't wait to share with you.



Year 3: Year 3 have been working really hard this week. In English we have been looking at writing a newspaper article based on Goldilocks and the three Bears. The children have been looking at alliteration and using inverted commas. In Maths we have been working on place value. On an afternoon we have been working on Challenge X.



Year 2. This week we have had George's Grandma from George's marvellous medicine visit us in class. She was extremely mean and told us we were not allowed to write anything about her. We decided that we were still going to write about her as everyone needs to know how nasty she really is.



Year 4: Another great week for year 4. We have revisited fractions this week which has been a bit challenging but everyone has tried very hard. We have been writing a story introduction, the children have produced some fantastic work. Challenge X has been the focus for our afternoons with children designing posters, practising a performance or planning and organising an event. Keep it up year 4.



Year 5: This week, we have been focussing on producing a character description of the Jabberwocky from Alice in Wonderland. In maths, we have been using our understanding of how to convert grams to kilograms and litres to millilitres to answer problem solving questions. During challenge X, we have been working collaboratively with others from different year groups to organise specific activities.



Year 6: A fantastic week of writing, Challenge X and leaver's preparation. In writing we have composed our leaver's assembly poem and have re-written the introductory chapter to Alex Rider's Stormbreaker. Year 6 have incorporated appropriate word choices – something we've focused on over the year. In Challenge X, we have continued to support children in all other year groups, after all we are the experts!
