I had a fantastic meeting with Claire from WDH who works to build community links. We will begin our journey with WDH in October

where some children will have the opportunity to plant spring bulbs in our local community. WDH have also offered to support the children plant spring bulbs as part of our environment too so in spring you should see a splash of colour shining through on those drizzly days.

Our fantatsic Eco Rangers visted a local nursing home today to ask the resident for advice form their own experiences growing fruit, vegetables and looking after their favourite plants. They have taken their yearly calendar to see if the residents have any advice for what is best to do in what season, and they have taken their plans for our own garden area to ask for ideas and inspiration.

An update on our garden area: We have fencing being completed over summer, then we can get a wildlife pond started. We have had out pond plants delivered ready to go in. We have also had lots of plant pots and compost delivered but we are awaiting the delivery of our trowels to be able to plant these. Our strawberry plants are enjoying some sun while they wait to also be planted. We have loads of seeds for vegetables and herbs we want to grow.

Attendance Matters

Our Pupil Parliament are updating our class attendance daily and helping promote the importance of good attendance in school. They are also handing out those precious letters that when collected, award the class with $\pounds 20$ to spend as they wish.

Next year, attendance will have a big focus within school. A printed letter has gone out explaining the changes the DFE have made as from August 19th 2024.

We will continue with rewards, class parties, and introduce fun assemblies with Classopoloy (a version on Monopoly) where children can see the impact of attendance of above 97%. If you attend a celebration assembly, attendance will no longer feature here as we are giving it its own assembly on a Monday. We will also be teaching the children why good attendance is vital not just to their learning, but to their friendships, mental health and the feeling of belonging. We already have so many incentives in school to support strong attendance and we aim to enhance this even further.

As part of Year 6s Enterprise project, they organised a bake sale. Thank you so much to everyone who donated cakes, traybakes and cupcakes - we are very grateful. Year 6 were very professional in selling their cakes and did a fantastic job raising £370!!
