Year 1

Year 1 P.E. is on a Tuesday. Please ensure the children bring the correct PE kit every week.

We have had a lovely final week to end the Spring term in Year 1. I cannot believe we only have one term left! The children are becoming independent, resilient and responsible learners-I am so proud of the progress they have made so far.

In our reading strategy lessons, we finished our story Dogger by Shirley Hughes. We completed our own book reviews and re-read our favourite parts of the story to our partner. The children blew me away with their amazing ideas about how Dogger connects to other stories they have read; it is wonderful to hear the children speak so passionately and excitedly. We then performed the poem 'Ten in a Bed' fluently as a class and discussed how this linked to our story.

In art, we developed our drawing skills by using wax crayons to create leaf and tree rubbings. In computing, we explored grouping and sorting objects by their colour, shape and size and in RE, the children completed a group assessment to answer the question 'what is Islam?'

The children have worked incredibly hard in all of our phonics sessions. As we continue to prepare for the phonics screening check, please ensure your child is reading daily, if possible. Thank you for your continued support.

Year 4


This term Year 4 have P.E on a Tuesday. Please ensure that children have the correct PE kit.

This term Year 6 have PE on a **Tuesday**. Please[\]ensure the children bring the correct PE kit every week.

This week the children have enjoyed PE and it was their final lesson of gymnastics. The children spent time practising a performance and thinking about how formations impact performance. The children created a group sequence using formations and apparatus. They ensured that their formations contrast in shape and level.

This week in maths, we have been learning about angles. Children learnt that angles on a straight line add up to 180° and angles around a point add up to 360°. We also learnt that vertically opposite angles are equal. Through investigation, children saw that there are two pairs of equal angles. We began to understand that vertically opposite angles are formed when two straight lines cross, and if either of the lines are not straight, then the angles formed are not vertically opposite.

Well done for all your hard work and resilience this term Y6! Have a great Easter!
